ALL CLOTHING MUST RESEMBLE EDUCATIONAL APPAREL IN STYLE AND COLOR. All items purchased from French Toast or other companies must resemble Educational Apparel styles.

BOYS

Grades K-4

Slacks:	Solid navy or khaki poly/cotton dress pants. These may be purchased anywhere but they must match E.A. or French Toast in style and color. No patch pockets or pockets on the legs.
Uniform Shorts:	Navy/khaki shorts from E.A. or French Toast only. Please follow dates on the school calendar for months shorts may be worn. <u>NO CAPRI PANTS.</u>
Belts:	Grades 2 and up. Solid colors with no ornamentation – Navy, blue, black, brown, or gray (required with pants and shorts that have belt loops unless banded polo is worn.) Belts are optional for grades K and 1.
Shirts:	Cotton, short- or long-sleeve, collared, button-front shirt – white or light blue.
Turtlenecks:	White/light blue/navy
Socks:	Navy, white, light blue, or khaki; socks should be visible at all times. (If the shoe obscures the socks as with high-tops or boots, the student may be asked to show that he or she is wearing socks during dress code checks.)
Earrings:	Boys may not wear earrings or tattoos of any kind. No body piercing.
Sweaters:	Solid navy crew neck cardigan; solid navy pullover v-neck
Sweater vests:	Solid navy v-neck sweater vests
School Sweatshirts:	School Eagles from E.A.
Sweatshirts:	Solid navy with no hoods or pockets
White Polo Shirts:	<u>Plain</u> white polo- may be purchased anywhere
Eagle Polo Shirts:	Navy, light blue, or gold <u>with Eagle emblem</u> – purchased from <u>E.A. only</u> ; <u>Banded</u> polo shirt may be worn with no belt.
P.E. Uniform:	Grades 3-12 – purchase through E.A. only. Solid navy sweatpants may be worn over P.E. shorts in cold weather. Sweatpants may have a solid stripe on the leg.
Shoes:	For safety purposes, shoes must have a back on the heel and sandals must have a heel strap.
Hair:	Well-groomed and normal coloring – New or unusual hairstyles not cleared with the office ahead of time may result in suspension or expulsion. Hair needs to be cut above the ears, eyebrows, and collar. Hair may not be bleached or dyed.
Make-up:	Boys are not allowed to wear makeup. Clear lip balm is not considered to be makeup.

Guidelines for Out of Dress Code Days:

ALL CLOTHING MUST RESEMBLE EDUCATIONAL APPAREL IN STYLE AND COLOR. All items purchased from French Toast or other companies must resemble Educational Apparel styles.

GIRLS

Grades K-4

- Navy Jumper:** Solid navy with rounded neck or v-neck from E.A. or French Toast only.
- Plaid Jumper:** Plaid jumper from E.A. or French Toast (blue/red plaid only). Length should be no shorter than top of the knee when standing.
- Slacks:** Solid navy or khaki poly/cotton dress pants. These may be purchased anywhere but they must match E.A. or French Toast in style and color. No patch pockets or pockets on the legs.
- Uniform Shorts:** Navy/khaki shorts from E.A. or French Toast only. Please follow dates on the school calendar for months shorts may be worn. **NO CAPRI PANTS.**
- Belts:** Grades 2 and up. Solid colors with no ornamentation – Navy, blue, black, brown, or gray (required with pants and shorts that have belt loops unless banded polo is worn.) Belts are optional for grades K and 1.
- Blouses:** Cotton, short- or long-sleeve with round collar – white or light blue.
- Turtlenecks:** White/light blue/navy
- Socks:** Navy, white, light blue, khaki (includes tights and cable tights); socks should be visible at all times. In cold weather, navy or white leggings may be worn under jumpers only for students in grades K-4. (If the shoe obscures the socks as with high-tops or boots, the student may be asked to show that he or she is wearing socks during dress code checks.)
- Hair Accessories:** Barrettes, bows, headbands, and beads may be any reasonable color. No large or distracting hair accessories and **NO bandanas.**
- Earrings:** No more than two earrings per ear. No body piercing or tattoos.
- Sweaters:** Solid navy crew neck cardigan; solid navy pullover v-neck
- Sweater vests:** Solid navy v-neck sweater vests
- School Sweatshirts:** School Eagles from E.A.
- Sweatshirts:** Solid navy with no hoods or pockets
- White Polo Shirts:** Plain white polo- may be purchased anywhere
- Eagle Polo Shirts:** Navy, light blue, or gold with Eagle emblem – purchased from E.A. only; Banded polo shirt may be worn with no belt.

Grades 5-6

Slacks:	Solid navy or khaki poly/cotton dress pants. These may be purchased anywhere but they must match E.A. or French Toast in style and color. No patch pockets or pockets on the legs. NO lowriders.
Uniform Shorts:	Navy/khaki shorts from E.A. or French Toast only. Please follow dates on the school calendar for months shorts may be worn. <u>NO CAPRI PANTS.</u>
Belts:	Grades 2 and up. Solid colors with no ornamentation – Navy, blue, black, brown, or gray (required with pants and shorts that have belt loops unless banded polo is worn.)
Dress Shirts:	Short- or long-sleeve <u>oxford with button-down collar</u> – white or light blue.
Turtlenecks:	White/light blue/navy
Socks:	Navy, white, light blue, or khaki; socks should be visible at all times. (If the shoe obscures the socks as with high-tops or boots, the student may be asked to show that he or she is wearing socks during dress code checks.)
Earrings:	Boys may not wear earrings or tattoos of any kind. No body piercing.

- Plaid Skirt:** Plaid skirt (blue/red plaid) from E.A./French Toast only. **NO SKORTS.** Length should be no shorter than the top of the knee when standing.
- Slacks:** Solid navy or khaki poly/cotton dress pants. These may be purchased anywhere but they must match E.A. or French Toast in style and color. No patch pockets or pockets on the legs.
- Uniform Shorts:** Navy/khaki shorts from E.A. or French Toast only. Please follow dates on the school calendar for months shorts may be worn. **NO CAPRI PANTS.**
- Belts:** Grades 2 and up. Solid colors with no ornamentation – Navy, blue, black, brown, or gray (required with pants and shorts that have belt loops unless banded polo is worn.)

Uniform Shorts:	Navy/khaki shorts from E.A. or French Toast only. Please follow dates on the school calendar for months shorts may be worn. <u>NO CAPRI PANTS.</u>
Belts:	Grades 2 and up. Solid colors with no ornamentation - Navy, blue, black, brown, or gray (required with pants and shorts that have belt loops unless banded polo is worn.)
Dress Shirts:	Short- or long-sleeve <u>oxford with button-down collar</u> - white or light blue.

Slacks:	Solid navy or khaki poly/cotton dress pants. These may be purchased anywhere but they must match E.A. or French Toast in style and color. No patch pockets or pockets on the legs.
Uniform Shorts:	Navy/khaki shorts from E.A. or French Toast <u>only</u> . Please follow dates on the school calendar for months shorts may be worn. <u>NO CAPRI PANTS</u> .

YOUNG MEN

GRADES 9-12

- Slacks:** Full-length, solid color (except white) cotton, corduroy, or dress pants, **NO JEANS, NO CAPRI PANTS**
- Shorts:** E.A. or French Toast knee-length shorts (EDCS selected items only)
- Belts:** To match clothing – required with pants or shorts when waistband (with belt loops) shows
- Shirts:** Collared shirts with sleeves, either button-down or polo style, any color (no thin or sheer fabrics)
- Turtlenecks:** Any color
- Socks:** Any reasonable style or color are allowed, but are not required
- Sweaters:** Appropriate styles of any color may be worn (No hoods, words, or pictures)
- Sweatshirts:** School Eagles from E.A. or plain solid-colored (No hoods, words, or pictures)
- P.E. Uniform:** Grades 3-12 – purchase through E.A. only. Solid navy sweatpants may be worn over P.E. shorts in cold weather. Sweatpants may have a solid stripe on the leg.
- Shoes:** Shoes are required at all times.
- Accessories:** No caps or hats may be worn during the school day and **NO bandanas** may be worn.
- Chapel Dress:** Navy or black pants, white cotton dress shirt, appropriate socks, shoes, belt, appropriate tie, navy or black sweater (if needed)
- Earrings:** Boys may not wear earrings or tattoos of any kind. NO body piercings.
- Hair:** Well-groomed and normal coloring. New and unusual hairstyles not cleared with the school office in advance may result in suspension or expulsions. Hair should be cut at the eyebrows or higher, trimmed neatly at the sides, and above the collar. Hair may not be bleached or dyed.
- Facial Hair:** No mustaches or beards. Sideburns should be well-trimmed and may not extend below the ear.
- Make-up:** Boys are not allowed to wear makeup. Clear lip balm is not considered to be makeup.

Guidelines for Out of Dress Code Days:

- Boys:** Ankle-length pants (no sagging pants); jeans (no holes or graffiti); jogging pants; UNIFORM SHORTS ONLY; shirts with sleeves (must be longer than waistline and meet EDCS Philosophy and standards); NO sports jerseys without an undershirt; NO bandanas.
- ☺ Only two bracelets may be worn at one time.
- ☺ **Any violation of the above: student may be kept out of class until correct clothing articles can be provided or may be sent home at the Administration's discretion.**

EDCS DRESS CODE FOR HIGH SCHOOL

YOUNG LADIES

GRADES 9-12

- Skirts:** Any knee-length or longer solid color (except white); **NO SKORTS**
- Slacks:** Full-length, solid-color (except white) cotton, corduroy, or dress pants, **NO JEANS, NO CAPRI PANTS**
- Shorts:** E.A. or French Toast knee-length shorts (EDCS selected items only)
- Belts:** To match clothing – required with pants or shorts when waistband (with belt loops) shows
- Shirts:** Collared shirts with sleeves, either button-down or polo style, any color (no thin or sheer fabrics); must be at waist or longer so that skin is not visible at the waistline; No low or revealing necklines
- Turtlenecks:** Any color
- Socks:** Any reasonable style socks or hose are allowed, but are not required
- Sweaters:** Appropriate styles of any color may be worn (No hoods, words, or pictures)
- Sweatshirts:** School Eagles from E.A. or plain solid-colored (No hoods, words, or pictures)
- P.E. Uniform:** Grades 3-12 – purchase through E.A. only. Solid navy sweatpants may be worn over P.E. shorts in cold weather. Sweatpants may have a solid stripe on the leg.
- Shoes:** Shoes must be worn at all times. No heel height to exceed 2 ½ inches.
- Hair Access.:** Barrettes, bows, headbands, and beads may be any reasonable color. No large or distracting hair accessories and **NO bandanas** may be worn.
- Chapel Dress:** Navy or black skirt, white cotton blouse, navy or black sweater (if needed), and shoes
- Earrings:** No more than two earrings per ear; No extremely large earrings; No body piercing or tattoos
- Hair:** Well-groomed and normal coloring – New or unusual hairstyles not cleared with the office ahead of time may result in suspension or expulsion.
- Make-up:** Junior high and high school girls may wear light make-up and nail polish. Determination of appropriateness is at the discretion of administration.

Guidelines for Out of Dress Code Days:

This program is designed to aid working parents. It involves adults supervising students before and after school. No tutoring services are included.

ACTIVITIES

Table games, crafts, papers, movies (approved through the office) and outdoor play are provided. Students **should not** bring toys from home.

COST FOR FULL TIME DAYCARE

1 student is \$110.00 A MONTH (1ST-8TH grades)

2 students are \$140 per month

3 students are \$170 per month

* If daycare is needed for a full day Kindergartener, the cost is already included in tuition.

FEES ARE DUE THE 1ST DAY OF EACH MONTH. Part time (occasional) students are \$15.00 per day. Students that attend morning daycare after 7:30am will not be charged. Fees are subject to change.

DISCIPLINE

Our adult workers have the same authority as the classroom teacher. These rules are necessary for each student's safety. Anyone refusing to cooperate will be asked to discontinue using this service.

DRESS CODE

For outdoor activities, students may change clothes. Slacks and jeans are permitted. Shorts may be worn; knee length, no holes. Refer to the school handbook concerning shirts and shoes.

FOOD

"Non-messy" breakfast items such as pop tarts, donuts or muffins may be brought to the morning daycare before 7:15am. Ice cream and snacks will be sold in afternoon daycare.

HOURS

Morning hours are 6:30am-7:50am, located in the cafeteria. Afternoon hours are 3:00pm-5:30pm, located in the cafeteria and some of the classrooms.

PICK-UP

The after school program closes at 5:30pm. Anyone arriving after 5:30pm will pay \$2.00 per minute late fee. After two late fees, you are asked to discontinue using the service for three days. If after returning and the problem continues, you will be asked to discontinue using the service for the rest of the school year. **All late payments must be paid the following day for your student to return to daycare.** Please remember our daycare workers are also our parents.

PHILOSOPHY OF EAST DAYTON CHRISTIAN SCHOOL

East Dayton Christian's philosophy is based on the Word of God. The primary objective and purpose of the school is to train the student in the way of life presented in the Scriptures while giving him a good education.

Since the primary reason for the existence of the school is a spiritual ministry, evangelistic efforts are made to bring all students to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ so that the teaching of spiritual truths may have a firm foundation. This is followed by instruction of the principles of God's Word.

The academic program, through the traditional approach, is developed to provide students with the best possible program of studies. There is emphasis on the mastery of the fundamental blocks of material necessary for satisfactory achievement in these areas. In the elementary, strong emphasis is placed on phonics and memorization of mathematical facts. In the upper elementary, stress is placed on the acquisition of facts and concepts in the areas of study, leading to the development and exercise of the powers of reasoning. Methods of teaching proven to be effective are utilized with a constant search for better methods. Realizing the difference in innate ability, we encourage each student to do his best. We believe the traditional system of education educates the mind and builds character. It encourages competition and teaches the value of living under a free enterprise system of government.

Character training is an important element in East Dayton Christian School. We believe that the heart of character training is obedience (deciding to do what is right), which will eventually cultivate an inner self-discipline and is essential to the emotional, physical, social, and spiritual well-being of the student.

The teacher is the authority in the classroom. Discipline is administered firmly, but fairly. To obey, to do right, to love God and country, and to always measure one's attitudes against the principles laid out in the Scriptures, are characteristics we strive to instill in each student, thus equipping him for his role in God's plan for his life and for his proper place in society.

STANDARDS OF CONDUCT

East Dayton Christian School holds that the Bible is the infallible, divine Word of God and that salvation by faith in Christ is the initial step in the Christian life. There is adequate Biblical basis for the idea of spiritual growth into the image of Christ (Romans 8:29), which is the work of the Holy Spirit (II Cor. 3:18). This growth begins with the initial act of saving faith and continues throughout life. The Holy Spirit makes the Christian conscious of the Biblical demands for a holy life which fulfills both God's moral law of love and high law of love (Mat. 22:37-39; Romans 13:8-10; Galatians 15:14). The result is a life consecrated unto God and separated from the world. East Dayton Christian must, therefore, provide an environment conducive to the spiritual growth and development of young people who are not yet mature Christians. A standard of conduct based on the following Biblical principles is necessary to provide such an environment. All of the activities of the Christian must be subordinated to the glory of God who indwells us (I Cor. 8:9, 12-13, 19:32). The Christian will endeavor to avoid practices which cause the loss of sensitivity to the spiritual needs of the world and the loss of the Christian's physical, mental, or spiritual well-being (I Cor. 9:27).

A sense of the need for spiritual growth in the light of these principles has led East Dayton Christian to adopt the following standards, which are believed to be conducive to the environment that will best promote the spiritual welfare of the student. The school, therefore, requests each student whether at home, school, or elsewhere, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week:

A. To refrain from:

- Indecent language, swearing
- Use, possession, distribution and/or sale of drugs, drug substances, drug-like substances, drug paraphernalia, alcohol, tobacco, and/or tobacco products
- Behavior that adversely affects the testimony of Jesus Christ, EDCS, and/or the student
- Aiding and/or abetting the above

B. On school premises or off school premises, at or involving any school sponsored activity or program, refrain from:

- Possession and/or concealment of a dangerous weapon
- False alarms and/or threats
- Possession and/or use of fireworks and/or explosives
- Stealing
- Forgery
- Destruction or defacing of school or private property
- Defiance of authority
- Deception, lying, and/or cheating
- Verbal/nonverbal/written abuse of staff or student(s)
- Vulgarity, profanity, or obscenities (verbal/nonverbal/written)
- Repeated violations of school rules
- Truancy
- Inappropriate dress
- Unauthorized absence from class or school

- Leaving school without authorization
- Disruptive behavior
- Fighting
- Disrespect
- Excessive unexcused tardiness to class and/or school
- Improper boy/girl relationship
- Inducing panic
- Harassment and/or bullying

Any of the above acts listed in A or B shall constitute sufficient cause for discipline, suspension, or expulsion.

East Dayton Christian admits students of any race, color, national or ethnic origin to all rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national, or ethnic origin in the administration or the educational policies. In keeping with our Christian standards, discrimination will not be tolerated, and is subject to disciplinary action.

The selection of the restrictions mentioned may appear arbitrary to some; but while not condemning others who see differently, East Dayton Christian believes that the restrictions named are outstanding types of conduct which are detrimental to the standards established as its objective.

In this atmosphere of definite and positive Christian standards of conduct, good scholastic planning and intimate personal interest between faculty and student, there is fine opportunity for development of strong Christian character.

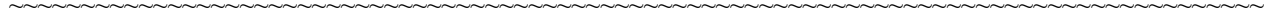
